Re: McKelvey Storm Sewer Project

Dear Springfield Township Resident:

I am pleased to report, the McKelvey storm sewer project will begin **the week of August 1st**. To alleviate the current roadway drainage issues, Springfield Township has contracted Stauffer Site Services to install new storm sewers on McKelvey Road and Sherwood Drive.

In order to accommodate the construction process, thru traffic will be limited. At times, residents within the project limits will not be able to access their driveways. Stauffer Site Services will send out advance notice to all affected property owners prior to the excavation of any driveway. In addition, signs will be placed to direct residents to alternative parking areas.

We will work to keep delay times to a minimum; however, they are to be expected. A project inspector will be on site to oversee the work and minimize inconveniences you may experience during construction.

Prior to the start of the project, it is important to remove any landscaping, underground irrigation or wiring from the right-of-way. With the exception of mailboxes, all landscape structures and decorative plants within 15 feet of the edge of the road should be temporarily relocated until the project is complete. If you have items such as an invisible fence, décor lighting or an irrigation system within this same area, please contact the Township Service Department at (513) 522-1410, or email mgould@springfieldtwp.org to schedule a meeting with a project inspector. The project inspector will assist in identifying those items in order minimize the risk of damage. Please know that it is your responsibility to remove any personal underground items from the right-of-way. Neither the Township, nor the construction companies are responsible for the damage of items installed within the right-of-way.
